Comments: Nurse Licensure Compact States. The NLC increases access to care while maintaining public protection at the state level. Under the NLC, nurses can practice in other NLC states, without having to obtain additional licenses.

Licensed students who live in a compact state can get a license in a noncompact state by applying for licensure by endorsement to the board of nursing in the state where they seek a license. They may be issued a single state license valid only in the state of issuance.

New Jersey has enacted the compact, but is only partially implemented as of 5/21/2020.

Indiana is scheduled to implement the compact on 7/1/2020.
