EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN (EMT)

EMTs provide basic life support (BLS), including airway management, oxygen administration, CPR, bleeding control, and spinal immobilization. They can assist with some medications like epinephrine and albuterol but have limited invasive interventions.

PREREQUISITES

- 17 years of age on or before the official end date of the course.
- Possession of a high school diploma, high school equivalency, or successful completion of an exam assessing basic reading comprehension skills at a minimum at the eleventh-grade level.

ADVANCED EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN (AEMT)

AEMTs build on EMT skills by providing some advanced life support (ALS) interventions, such as intravenous (IV) therapy, advanced airway management, and administration of a broader range of medications.

PREREQUISITES

- 17 years of age on or before the official end date of the course.
- High school diploma or high school equivalent.
- Possession of a valid and active North Carolina EMT Credential, NREMT, or other states' EMS Credential prior to the start of the clinical or field component.
- Successful completion of college-level English, or within the previous 12 months complete a written assessment placing the individual into college-level English.
- Successful completion of college-level Math, or within the previous 12 months complete a written assessment placing the individual into college-level Math.

PARAMEDIC

Delivers the highest level of prehospital care, including advanced airway management, ECG interpretation, drug administration, and critical decision-making in emergencies.

PREREQUISITES

- 17 years of age on or before the end date of the course.
- High school diploma or high school equivalency.
- Possession of a valid and active NC EMT/AEMT Credential, NREMT, or other states.
- Successful completion of college-level English, or within the previous 12 months complete a written assessment, placing the individual into college-level English.
- Successful completion of college-level Math, or within the previous 12 months complete a written assessment, placing the individual into college-level Math.
- Successful completion of a college-level Anatomy and Physiology course prior to the start of the field education component.
